



It is important to note that, at the moment, adding the Makachain network to Binance must be done manually. First download the Binance Chrome extension [here](#). Then log in to your Binance Wallet using your credentials and proceed with the manual network configuration.






After logging in Click on the “All Networks” button






Then click on the “Custom” Network button






After clicking Save, you will need to check that you are aware of the security alert, and then confirm






And now you can see that the Makachain network is connected to your Binance wallet

You can also click on the All Networks button, and then you can look for the Makachain network on the search bar



How Do Transaction Fees Work in Makachain?

In Makachain, the native token is called MFUEL. This token is used to pay transaction fees (also known as gas fees), just like in other blockchains.

But here's the big difference: **MFUEL has zero value.**

This means that even though the system technically charges you gas in MFUEL, you're not actually paying anything, because its value is 0. In other words, you can send transactions without worrying about having a gas balance.

Also, you don't need to buy MFUEL. The network automatically refills it for you whenever you need it, so you'll always have enough to operate.

So, how does the network make money if gas is free?

The answer is simple: every time you make a transaction, the network charges a small

fixed fee of 10 cents (USD 0.10) in the same currency you're sending.

For example:

- If you send **50 USDT**, you'll pay **\$0.10** worth in USDT as a fee.
